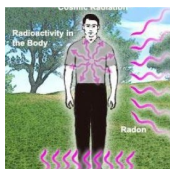

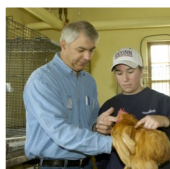
## [Environmental Radiation](#)
